Get an Oregon ID

To apply for your Oregon state identification card (often called a photo ID), you need to bring proof of your identity and proof of your current residence to the Oregon Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV).

Your birth certificate or I-94 form is an easy way to prove your identity. If your name has changed since birth, you will also need proof of the name change, such as a marriage certificate.

The proof of address can be any official document that includes both your name and address on it, such as your rental agreement, current utility bill, recent pay stub, voter registration card, or a letter from a social service provider. A sample letter that can be used to meet this requirement if you are homeless is attached.

The DMV requires you to pay the exact fee for the type of ID you need.

- New Application/Original ID (first card or card expired more than 12 months ago): **\$44.50**
- Replacement ID (for a lost card that was not expired or expired less than 12 months ago): **\$39.50**
- Renewal (card is about to expire or expired less than 12 months ago): **\$40.50**
