Market Rate Rental Apartments

Market rate rental apartments are the most common apartments available. When you live in this type of housing, you pay a monthly rent that is set by the owner and is written into your rental agreement. Your monthly rent is not adjusted based on your income.

This list includes website information for market rate rental apartments, but is meant to be a starting point only. There are many ways to search for market rate housing. To find an apartment, you will want to use as many of these strategies as possible. Once you locate an apartment you are interested in, you will need to complete an application and pay an application fee immediately to hold the apartment while your application is being screened.

To search for vacancies, there are several online tools that you can use.
